Spiritual Vitality

REV. DR. DOUG CEDERBERG | GPC DESIGNATED TERM PASTOR NOVEMBER 10, 2021

fter a year of being with you at GPC,
I have a thought I'd like to share with
you this week. I have been told again and again
how weary you all are of the decade-old search
for the right mission and vision statements,
strategic plans, and effective marketing strategy.
The mindset has been, "If only we get those things
right, we will succeed in bringing GPC into a new
chapter of life."

I have a differing idea, based on Zechariah 4:6. "This is the word of the Lord: Not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, says the Lord of hosts." Therefore, it will not be by anything other than spiritual vitality that GPC or any other church will make it in the 21st century. For the past 30 years in ministry, I have seen churches pin their hopes on business tactics, in particular, from the field of marketing. Seldom, if ever, have I seen this actually bring new people and new life into a church, in a lasting way.

First, let me state an old proverb from the field of business marketing: *No amount of marketing can save a bad product*.

Second, this proverb is backed up by an old story from the field of business marketing: A dog food company had just come out with a new product a year earlier. The can was covered with a bright, cheery label that caught the shopper's eye in the grocery store. The TV commercial for the dog food had a catchy tune and touted its all-natural ingredients. The "face" of the product was the winner of the prestigious Westminster Dog Show. In spite of all of this, the product's sales were dismal and continually getting even worse.

The Vice President of Marketing of the company called his department together to discuss the problem. He chided his employees, "We have the snazziest label in the business. Our TV commercial is loved by viewers. Our supply chain is second to none. Why then are people not buying our dog food?" A market researcher sheepishly raised his hand to answer the boss, "The truth is, sir, the dogs won't eat it; they can't stand the taste." Yes indeed, no amount of marketing can save a bad product.

You can't outsmart a dog when it comes to what tastes good or not. Similarly, a church cannot outsmart the non-churchgoer with a lot of pizzazz, fancy mission statements, and clever marketing. The church is either a place where a person can experience God or not. And that will depend on whether the people already in the church are experiencing and finding joy in God or not.

Our "product" is a relationship with God through Jesus by the activity of the Holy Spirit in and among us. If the people of our church are not experiencing this for others to come and experience also, then no amount of all that business stuff will save a bad product.

It starts with faith that God makes a world of difference in your own life. Then, this enthusiasm is shared with others in the church, and thus it builds. It continues by being together in our experience of God each Sunday. And then it shows in our lives and makes an impression on people outside the church.

Now that we are resolved to keeping GPC going, it is only by the Spirit of God that GPC will be alive. Pray that God's spirit will come into your life and into the life of our church.

On a personal note, I must share these thoughts as we celebrate our National Holiday, Veterans Day, on November 11, 2021. For generations, the men and women of America's Armed Forces have demonstrated their willingness to put the country before themselves; patriots who serve for the greater good and who don't seek glory or recognition or personal gain. Over 100 years ago, on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month in 1918, the Great War – the war to end all wars – finally ended. Congress established a holiday called Armistice Day to commemorate the day. This day marks an opportunity to also pay our respects to those who have served so nobly. Years later, the day was changed to Veterans Day.

Our nation honors all those who made the ultimate, supreme sacrifice to protect our Nation in the name of liberty and justice; and to acknowledge the contributions of the nearly 22 million veterans living today. And while Veterans Day is a day set aside to thank and honor ALL who have served, living or deceased, it should also be a day for all Americans to be a part of, because every citizen has a role to play in carrying the legacy and burden of freedom.

I must also acknowledge the sacrifices of the family members of all those who served. It is the family of loved ones who enabled our Servicemembers to serve so nobly. Thank you to ALL in our Church Family whose loved ones served our Nation!

Some feedback from our most recent GB meeting:

- **a.** CANA has returned to hold their church services on Sundays at 4:30 PM in the Chapel, beginning on October 17th. We warmly welcome them back. Also, WIMS church continues to use our Sanctuary each Sunday at noon for their church service.
- **b.** Fales Street lot restoration is finished and looks great. A storage shed is installed.
- **c.**The Facility Use Team has updated our facility use agreement for all building users.
- **d.** The Selah facilities are closed and weatherized for the season. Selah Team input to the GB expressed their intent to ensure the property is preserved as a natural space to honor our church historical leaders.
- **e.** GPC Facility User Fees have been reviewed and increased.
- **f.** The Stewardship Team reminds us that continued Congregational financial support remains essential. Note: look ahead to Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas for special giving opportunities.
- **g.** Social Media Guidelines have been established and posted on our website. We need volunteers to work on the Social Media Team.
- **h.** The Finance Team summary through October: while the budget is holding its own for income and expenses, our expenses were higher this month, primarily due to Fales Street Wall repairs which came in under its budget at \$37,000.
- i. Added: It is not too soon for our church Teams to begin developing their Annual Reports for this operating year.


available every Sunday from Karen Allen.
